

## Young Executive of the Year Award



### **Rebecca Wiczorek, CHE**

Rebecca Wiczorek, CHE, has been chosen to receive the 2008 ACHE Young Executive of the Year Award. Rebecca is the director of the University of Wisconsin Hospital and Clinics (UWHC) Neurosciences Service Line. She is responsible for operations and strategic business development of neurological and neurosurgical programs. Prior to her current position, Rebecca served UWHC as the Assistant Director for Regional Development, where she was responsible for developing clinical and operational relationships with regional hospitals and health systems. In that role, she worked extensively with the UW Regional Cancer Center network. Prior to joining UWHC, Rebecca held the position of Health Services Administrator for Clinical Outreach Services at the University of Iowa Hospitals and Clinics in Iowa City. She also served as the University's institutional member on several joint venture boards, and was responsible for developing the University of Iowa Health Care's critical access hospital network.

Rebecca has been a member of ACHE since December 1999. She received her Bachelor of Arts degree in psychology from Carleton College in Northfield, Minnesota, and her Masters degree in health care administration from the University of Iowa. She completed a residency and fellowship in hospital administration at the University of Iowa Hospitals and Clinics. Additionally, she was a recipient of the 1998 ACHE Foster G. McGaw Scholarship.

As the Wisconsin Chapter of ACHE has regionalized the delivery of educational offerings throughout Wisconsin, Rebecca has served as one of the Madison area education coordinators for the past two years. In addition, she recently served as a preceptor for a health care administrative intern.

## Regent's Senior Level Health Care Executive Award



### **Loren Anderson, FACHE**

Loren Anderson, FACHE, has been selected to receive the 2008 ACHE Regent's Senior Level Health Care Executive Award. Loren joined ACHE as a student member in 1972, while pursuing a Master of Science in Health Services

Management at the University of Missouri-Columbia. Once he served as a health care CEO for a South Dakota hospital and nursing home, he quickly realized ACHE could help him develop his leadership skills, and made it a personal goal to achieve each level of membership as quickly as possible, which he did.

After a brief stint with the American Hospital Association in Missouri, Loren joined Community Memorial Hospital in Menomonee Falls, Wisconsin, as its vice president and immediately became active in the area's Young Administrators Group, a precursor of today's Wisconsin Chapter of ACHE.

He joined ACHE in 1976, achieved Diplomate status in 1979, and reached Fellowship for the first time in 1985. Since that time, he has undergone re-certification twice and has served as a mentor for candidates considering ACHE and for those advancing through its various levels. He has received numerous professional awards and recognitions at the national, state, and local level.

In 1988, Loren joined Lakeland Medical Center in Elkhorn, Wisconsin, where he oversaw Lakeland's affiliation with Aurora Health Care in 1995. When Aurora re-organized into its current regional structure in 1997, he was named executive vice president for Aurora Health Care's South Region. Under Loren's administration, the South Region grew to include three acute care facilities, an ambulatory surgical center, 15 clinics, a visiting nurse association, and a free-standing community wellness center; 130 physicians and 3,500 other staff members, with regional net revenues approaching \$500 million.

The South Region's hospitals and physicians have been recognized nationally for their quality of care, receiving CMS and Premier quality awards.

## Regent's Senior Level Health Care Executive Award



### **Douglas Guy, LFACHE**

Douglas Guy, LFACHE, is a Life Fellow in ACHE and has been selected to receive the 2008 ACHE Regent's Senior Level Health Care Executive Award.

Doug has been a member of ACHE since August 1977, and a Fellow since 1994. He is currently the chief executive officer of Community Health Network in Berlin, Wisconsin. Prior to joining Community Health Network in October 2006, Doug served as a consultant to ProHealth Care, Inc., which is now in partnership/affiliation with Oconomowoc Memorial Hospital. Prior to his consultation services, Doug served as the CEO of Oconomowoc Memorial Hospital for 11 years. During this time, Doug was the very first recipient of the Partners of WHA Best of the Best Administration Award in 1994.

Doug also held the position of senior vice president and chief operating officer at Sinai Samaritan Medical Center in Milwaukee for four years, and the vice president for center operations and other positions at Mercy Catholic Medical Center in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, for 12 years.

He has been supportive of individuals interested in and seeking careers in health care and health care administration. He is currently an adjunct professor at Concordia University in Mequon, Wisconsin, where he teaches courses in health care economics and leadership.
