## The Future of the Physician Workforce

### Program Description:

Health care workforce planning remains a significant issue for public health initiatives as well as for health care administrators examining how their organizations will be able to meet the demand for clinical services. Physician workforce planning is even more challenging as there are a number of factors influencing graduating medical school students in their choice of specialty, the aging of the current physician workforce, and changing demographics that generate different health care needs.

**Carl J. Getto, MD**, Associate Dean for Hospital Affairs, University of Wisconsin School of Medicine and Public Health; Senior Vice President for Medical Affairs, University of Wisconsin Hospital and Clinics; Professor, Psychiatry

Carl J. Getto, MD, assumed the position of associate dean for hospital affairs at University of Wisconsin School of Medicine and Public Health and senior vice president for medical affairs at University of Wisconsin Hospital and Clinics in November 2001. He also is appointed as a professor of psychiatry.

A native of Chicago, Dr. Getto began his career at the University of Wisconsin, where he served as professor of psychiatry, acting dean of the medical school and, for eight years, UW Hospital's director of clinical affairs, before leaving Wisconsin in 1993 to become dean and provost at the University of Southern Illinois Medical School.

Since returning to UW Hospital in 2001, his primary responsibilities include the medical leadership of patient-care activities and accreditation of attending and resident physicians.

In addition to these responsibilities, he has served as Chair of the Council on Graduate Medical Education, and he has been a member of the Interdisciplinary Education Task Force of the Institute of Medicine. He currently chairs the Wisconsin Hospital Association/State Medical Society task force on physician workforce.

Dr. Getto received an MBA from the Kellogg School of Business at Northwestern University. He completed his residency at the University of Colorado Medical Center, and attended Medical School at Loyola University Stritch School of Medicine in Chicago. He holds a BA from St. Mary's College in Winona, Minnesota.
