STEPHEN BEESON, MD

Stephen Beeson, MD is a board-certified family medicine physician and a recognized expert in physician coaching, engagement and performance improvement. He has authored two national best-selling books, “Practicing Excellence: A Physician’s Manual to Exceptional Health Care” (2006) and “Engaging Physicians: A Manual to Physician Partnership” (2009), and has spent the past eight years lecturing to more than 500 health care systems. He is co-founder of the Physician Effectiveness Project at Practicingexcellence.com, a web-based, CME-certified interactive physician learning platform used to build physician skills in patient-centeredness, quality and safety, high-performing teams, leadership and influence and building collaborative group culture.

As the physician director for Sharp Experience, a highly effective organizational change effort at Sharp HealthCare in San Diego, Dr. Beeson helped to improve physician performance in patient satisfaction from the sixth percentile to above the 90th percentile nationally. His efforts contributed to Sharp HealthCare winning the Malcolm Baldrige Award for performance excellence in 2007. Sharp HealthCare demonstrated its support by funding the Physician Effectiveness Project, allowing Dr. Beeson to share proven techniques with other organizations.



MICHAEL GUTHRIE, MD, MBA

Michael Guthrie, MD, MBA is an executive-in-residence at the University of Colorado-Denver’s School of Business program in health administration. He is also an executive coach, focused exclusively on physician leadership improvement. He leads learning collaboratives for health care leadership teams, boards of trustees and physician leader groups within organizations. He is known as a thought leader in physician engagement and physician relationship strategy for hospitals and health systems.

Dr. Guthrie has been a practicing physician, medical director, chief operating officer, health system CEO and senior executive for a national health care alliance. He is a frequent speaker for health systems and national organizations on physician leadership, physician organizations, team management and health care strategy. He has served on the editorial advisory boards for several national health care journals and has published more than 50 articles on health care management and physician leadership topics.



ALAN KAPLAN, MD

Alan Kaplan, MD is the chief executive officer of UW Health, a role he has held since May 2016. He is a nationally renowned health care leader with a proven track record of leading large-scale clinical and cultural transformation with a focus on care coordination.

Dr. Kaplan previously served as executive vice president and chief clinical transformation officer for UnityPoint Health, a multi-state, integrated health system based in West Des Moines, Iowa. He was also the founder and president/CEO of UnityPoint Clinic, where he provided leadership for 1,300 providers. In addition, he served as president/CEO of UnityPoint at Home, a provider of home care, palliative, hospice and home infusion services. Prior to joining UnityPoint Health in 2009, he served as vice president and chief medical officer at Edward Health Services Corp., a health care system based in Naperville, Illinois.

Dr. Kaplan earned his medical degree from Rush University in Chicago, is board-certified in emergency medicine and earned a Master’s degree in medical management from Carnegie Mellon University. He is a Fellow of the American College of Healthcare Executives and a Fellow of the American Association of Physician Leadership, where he previously served as chairman of the board.
