2. Name three patient populations in which asymptomatic bacteriuria is a common finding.
3. Name three myths regarding the correct diagnosis of a true urinary tract infection.

2. Explain the concept of a “Watch and Wait Prescription” for acute otitis media.
3. Explain when it is and is not appropriate to use antibiotics for dental pain.

2. Name an acceptable alternative to azithromycin for treating community-acquired bacterial pneumonia.
3. Identify the first-line antibiotic for the large majority of dental infections.

Journal Club #4: Pre-op Urinalysis Before Orthopedic Surgery—What is the Current Evidence? Monday, October 15, 2018

Learning Objectives:

1. Recognize the prevalence of asymptomatic bacteriuria in healthy young women and in women who reside in a long-term care facility.
2. Identify at least one risk to the patient when one orders a screening urinalysis prior to an orthopedic procedure.
3. Identify three clinical scenarios where the best available evidence states that it is ok to screen for asymptomatic bacteriuria.
