## WHA virtual event sets the stage for this fall's Workforce Forum

The <u>WHA 2023 Wisconsin Health Care Workforce Report</u> was released on March 28, 2023, and the next day 149 health care leaders joined WHA Senior Vice President of Workforce and Clinical Practice Ann Zenk at WHA's second annual Workforce Virtual Forum.

Zenk provided an hour-long briefing highlighting WHA Information Center workforce data, state and national trends and WHA's recommendations for actions health care leaders, state policymakers and other stakeholders can take together to overcome the challenges confronting health care and the health care workforce.
