## U.S. Rep. Steil Seeks Nominations for Wisconsin's First Congressional District's Health Care Worker of the Year Award

Congressman Bryan Steil (WI-01) is now accepting submissions for Wisconsin's First Congressional District's 2023 Health Care Worker of the Year Award. This award recognizes unsung heroes in our community who have gone above and beyond to care for Wisconsin families.

"Our doctors, nurses, and health care providers provide our community with the utmost care and compassion. It's important to thank and recognize our health care workers for the services they provide. I look forward the recognizing this year's heroes," said Steil.

The recipient of the Health Care Worker of the Year Award will be selected based on the following criteria:

- **SERVICE:** Displays exemplary service and performance in their profession
- **DEDICATION:** Goes above and beyond the call of duty in performing their responsibilities
- **SELFLESSNESS:** Displays self-sacrifice and selflessness in caring for others

The nominee must reside in Wisconsin's First Congressional District



(nominee may work at a facility outside the first district) and be a licensed health care professional (doctor, nurse, nurse practitioner, physician assistant, etc.)
