Wisconsin hospitals use 340B savings to benefit their local communities by expanding access to important health care services, including:












And yet, large drug companies continue to deny required 340B discounts at community pharmacies hospitals contract with to dispense medications.




Meanwhile Pharmacy Benefit Manager middlemen have created policies that allow them to pocket 340B savings Congress intended to go to hospitals.

Drugmakers' Actions are Harming 340B Hospitals

Does not cost taxpayers, employers, or insurers a dime because it is funded by drug manufacturer discounts.



Is one of the few tools hospitals have to offset skyrocketing drug costs.

Protect 340B from Dishonest Attacks

PhRMA Claims do not Match Reality

CLAIM

340B needs to be scaled back to benefit only safety net hospitals.



Hospitals must be a CAH, cancer/children's hospital, government affiliated, or serve a disproportionate share of Medicaid patients to qualify.



340B discounts must go toward patient care.



They already do. See the reverse page for examples of what hospitals do with savings from 340B.

CLAIM

340B needs more transparency.



HRSA already preforms 200 rigorous audits of 340B entities each year, compared to 5 drug manufacturer audits.

While drug companies continue to grow record profits, hospitals are facing one of the hardest times in recent memory - with stagnant revenues from Medicare and Medicaid



How can lawmakers help?

HOUSE:

Support the <u>340B PATIENTS Act of 2024</u> to prohibit drug companies from denying contract pharmacy discounts

and the PROTECT 340B Act of 2023 to fix Discriminatory PBM Reimbursement.

SENATE:

Support SUSTAIN 340B Act introduced by bipartisan gang of 6 senators: Thune, Baldwin, Moran, Capito, Cardin, Stabenow. Fix Contract Pharmacy Restrictions and Discriminatory PBM Reimbursement.
