Join WHA in Washington, D.C. on April 20-21 for AHA Annual Meeting



WHA invites its members to join fellow Wisconsin hospital and health system leaders at the upcoming American Hospital Association (AHA) Annual Meeting April 20-21 at the Marriott Marquis in Washington, D.C.

The AHA Annual Meeting provides insightful programming and offers a great opportunity for networking and connecting with key decision makers on Capitol Hill about issues important to Wisconsin hospitals and health systems. In addition, WHA hosts several Wisconsin-specific events during the meeting, including an issues briefing luncheon, a members-only dinner and WHA-scheduled Hill visits with Wisconsin's members of Congress.
