

# Press Release: WHA Applauds Bipartisan Budget for Hospitals

The Wisconsin Hospital Association released the following statement from President and CEO Kyle O'Brien praising the bipartisan budget agreement between legislative leaders and Gov. Evers that was signed into law on July 3, 2025:

"WHA is proud to have worked with the Governor and legislative leaders to craft a plan that provides unprecedented Medicaid rate support to hospitals in this state budget. This increased funding will help hospitals sustain and expand access to care for patients across Wisconsin when one-third of the state's hospitals are operating at a deficit, driven by \$1.6 billion in losses from Medicaid reimbursement.

"Wisconsin's hospitals are the cornerstone of our healthcare system and a safety net for Wisconsin families, with many services, like behavioral health and labor and delivery, provided at a loss. Many of these services simply wouldn't exist if it weren't for the commitment of hospitals and health systems.

"Hospitals must have sustainable funding if we expect them to maintain and expand critical services that communities need. We applaud the policymakers on both sides of the aisle who recognized this reality and supported a state budget that will provide significant investments in our hospital safety net."

A recent report from the Wisconsin Hospital Association found that 55 of the state's 167 hospitals were operating at a loss. A recent poll found that Wisconsin voters are overwhelmingly alarmed by hospital closures, especially in rural areas where the impacts of those closures have been felt the hardest.

O'Brien also commented on key reforms made to worker's compensation that were included in the deal, saying, "Under the budget bill, worker's compensation insurance carriers and self-funded employers would be given a different maximum rate of reimbursement for certain hospital services if they reimburse a hospital claim promptly. This timely payment reform to the worker's compensation system is something that hospitals have sought for years, as worker's compensation carriers are often the slowest to reimburse a hospital for care provided to injured workers."

# WI State Budget Bill Includes Historic Medicaid Rate Increase for Hospitals

Early this morning, Governor Tony Evers signed into law the 2025-2027 biennial state budget, which includes the largest net increase in Medicaid reimbursement to hospitals ever enacted in Wisconsin via an expansion of our existing hospital assessment (state directed payment program/DPP). This occurred after a marathon legislative session between the state Assembly and Senate that ended shortly after midnight with support from Republicans and Democrats in both houses of the Legislature.

The State Legislature and Governor acted with urgency to beat a federal freeze on hospital taxes and directed payments included in the federal reconciliation package known as the One Big Beautiful Bill, which President Trump has been saying for months he intends to sign into law by the 4th of July.

WHA released a statement this morning applauding the Governor and the legislature for partnering with WHA to craft a budget proposal that provides unprecedented Medicaid rate increases to Wisconsin hospitals.

"Wisconsin's hospitals are the cornerstone of our healthcare system and a safety net for Wisconsin families, with many services, like behavioral health and labor and delivery, provided at a loss. Many of these services simply wouldn't exist if it weren't for the commitment of hospitals and health systems," said WHA President and CEO Kyle O'Brien in a statement. "Hospitals must have sustainable funding if we expect them to maintain and expand critical services that communities need. We applied the policymakers on both sides of the aisle who recognized this reality and supported a state budget that will provide significant investments in our hospital safety net" he added.

As of press time, the U.S. House is expected to concur in the same legislation passed by the U.S. Senate on July 1, clearing the way for President Trump to act on July 4. By acting when it did, the State Legislature avoided a scenario WHA has been working to prevent for months: having Wisconsin's hospital tax of 1.8% (one of the lowest in the country) and corresponding federal Medicaid reimbursements it generates permanently frozen at a rate lower than most of the states in the country.

"Now nearly four decades later, I am truly honored to be a part of the next generation of Wisconsin health care advocates and am very grateful to those who have contributed the resources to make this possible. And best of all, it will be an opportunity right here at WHA. No better place to learn. Very exciting for all involved."

This new scholarship honors Eric's unwavering commitment to advancing public policies that have helped Wisconsin hospitals lead the nation in quality, access and innovation. Throughout his career, Eric championed countless initiatives that continue to shape the state's health care landscape—from restoring medical liability reforms to expanding Medicaid hospital funding and guiding WHA's leadership during the COVID-19 pandemic.

"Eric's legacy is one of bold advocacy and strategic leadership. This scholarship ensures that future leaders will be inspired and equipped to carry forward that same mission," said WHA Board Chair Dr. Jeff Bahr.

### **A Lasting Legacy for Future Advocates**

Each year, two students will participate in a 15-week WHA internship, gaining hands-on experience in health policy, regulatory affairs and advocacy. Following the internship, participants will present their work to the WHA Foundation and may be awarded up to \$5,000 each. The program aims to cultivate future leaders who share Eric's passion for improving health care through smart, effective policy.

The WHA Foundation has already raised more than \$230,000 to fund the program. The scholarship was formally announced by WHA Senior Vice President, Government Relations and incoming President and CEO Kyle O'Brien at Eric's retirement reception on June 19.


# Wisconsin Hospitals State PAC & Conduit Campaign Nears Halfway Mark
